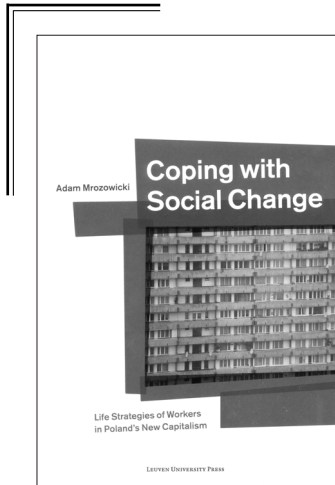

From the Author:

Challenging the understanding of manual workers as the passive and non-reflexive victims of historical and social forces, this book explores conditions, forms and consequences of worker agency in new capitalism in Poland. It demonstrates how the different strategies of coping with social change are reflexively developed by the distinctive fractions of workers' milieus in the context of their diversified resources and ethos carried over from the specificities of their past experiences. Based on an in-depth analysis of 166 personal interviews with blue-collar workers, the author proposes an empirically grounded understanding of working-class life strategies and links it with the theories of Pierre Bourdieu and Margaret Archer. Exploring the life strategies of the socially disadvantaged, this book is of interest not only to the students of post-socialism and working-class theory, but also to anybody inclined to think critically about workers' empowerment in late capitalist societies.

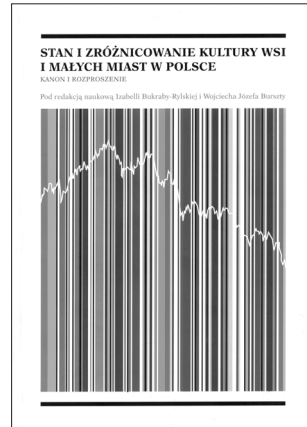
