

The Polish pendulum migration to Western Europe after the fall of the Iron Curtain has not only boosted economic productivity, but has also had an impact on the minds of the people involved. Polish immigrants came into contact with a different society to the one they had known, and their Western European employers became acquainted for the first time with Eastern European individuals. This monograph analyses how this pendulum migration has influenced perceptions, identities, values and social capital of both the host society and the migrants themselves. By means of interviews with Poles and Belgians in a Belgian provincial city (Leuven), it analyses to what extend this migration has contributed to the construction of European identities.





Peripheries are traditionally viewed as dependent on centres and doomed to dependence. This book represents a different approach, whereby it is argued that centre and periphery are always in two-way relations and that social life in the periphery cannot be perceived only as passive response to stimuli coming from centres. This approach, whether labelled interactionist or contextual, relies on new concepts in social sciences, notably in sociology, social geography and discourse analysis. As an illustration of this paradigm, the book analyses symbolic relations between Warsaw and three major Polish urban centres: Kraków, Poznań and Upper Silesia.
