



This book presents the process of implementation and effects of social innovation, tested in the project "To give what is really needed... An innovative model of professional home care for dependent, terminally, and chronically ill people and support for their caregivers in rural areas. It was

one of seven innovations selected for testing by the European Commission in the Call for proposals on social innovation and national reforms—long-term care. The aim was to find actions that could become model solutions as the most promising to respond to the pressing needs of the aging rural population and problems with access to appropriate services. The innovation was a new model of home hospice care in rural areas. A key stage of innovation was a multi-level construction model, a sustainable partnership of local institutions, called a network. "Networking" covered state and nongovernmental institutions providing care and professional medical and social support. In addition, the local Coordinator of Care for Dependent Persons (KOOZ) position has been created. The task of the KOOZ was to coordinate activities leading to the improvement of the possibilities and quality of cooperation and the availability of services addressed to the elderly and dependent people and people caring for them daily. The third goal of the implemented model was to strengthen the available resources of professionals, who should provide the most adequate support, in response to the real and well-diagnosed needs of innovation beneficiaries. Researchers observed all implementations of the innovation process, and qualitative and quantitative studies were carried out in the Podlaskie and Podkarpackie communes.

As a result of the activities undertaken in the innovation, recommendations were developed jointly with the provincial and national authorities, containing assumptions regarding the necessary systemic reforms, the construction of the long-term care system, and care for terminally ill and dependent people and their caregivers—in their homes, in the countryside.
